WHAT WE DO

The ACU works to achieve health equity for the underserved through professional education, training and technical assistance, clinical tools, and more. A few examples of our recent programs to improve care for the underserved include:

THE STAR² CENTER

Our Solutions, Training, and Assistance for Recruitment and Retention (STAR²) Center works closely with the Bureau of Primary Health Care to help build and sustain a robust health center workforce through resources, trainings, and technical assistance for health centers, PCAs, and HCCNs.



SUICIDE SAFER CARE

A groundbreaking curriculum training primary care providers and their teams in evidence-based strategies to prevent suicide in primary care, reaching 1,000+ providers in 2020 alone.

VISION SERVICES

An initiative to improve eye and vision health for the underserved through mobile vision screenings and grants for health centers. Since 2017, we've provided 3,500 screenings, with 80% receiving Rx glasses or readers.

WHAT WE DO

In addition to our growing programs, we also train thousands of clinicians each year in our virtual and in-person annual conferences and webinars.



ANNUAL ACU CONFERENCE

The ACU unites hundreds of clinicians and advocates working to improve care for the underserved at our Annual Conference in the heart of D.C.
